Reduced water pressure and possible water discoloration in Pierrefonds-Roxboro and in Dollard-des-Ormeaux

Likelihood of reduced pressure

- Every precaution is taken to avoid any disruptions, some operations may cause a drop in tap water pressure on **October 15, between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m.**
- Impact: water pressure reduced by **5 to 15 psi**, depending on the area.
- The pressure may be notably lower during the times of day when demand is highest. To find out more, type [low water pressure](#) in the search box on Montréal.ca.

Discoloured tap water

- Potential impact on your tap water**
- Yellow, brown or red tint. **See the instructions on the back of this notice before consuming your tap water.**
 - This disruption may occur at different times and normally lasts for a very short period.
 - Should it persist beyond the period shown above, contact 311.

What does the work involve?

- Re-commissioning of a water pipe following its inspection.

See the map on the back to find out which area could be affected by potential pressure drops and the possibility of discolored water.

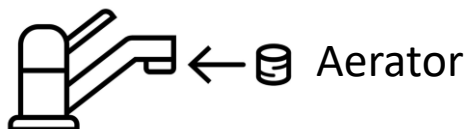
Instructions in case of water discoloration

Turn on the cold tap water

- Preferably in your bathtub, or in your kitchen. If your building (such as a store) is equipped with neither a tub or a sink, open whatever cold water tap is available.
- Let the cold water run until it is clear.
- Tap water will then be safe to consume.

Does your tap have an aerator?

- It is recommended to unscrew the tip to remove it, prior to letting the water run.



Important

- To avoid staining fabrics or damaging equipment, make sure the water is clear before doing laundry or using equipment that requires water.
