HALL RENTALS FOR YOUR CELEBRATIONS

The City has three halls to rent for parties, exhibitions or seminars, with access to a kitchen if required. The seating capacity is 200 in the **Banquet Hall**, 120 in the **Reception Hall**, and 64 in the **Park View Hall**, which is wheelchair accessible, with reserved parking for the disabled. The rental includes tables and chairs; you must make outside arrangements if you require a caterer, tablecloths, tableware, a sound system and microphone, etc. A minimum of one-month notice is required to reserve the halls.



The Dollard-des-Ormeaux Public Library offers DDO residents a variety of free services for members of all ages. The renovated library offers users a new, spacious library, at the cutting edge of technology: a third space where life is good.

Collection

The collection includes over 125,000 documents. French and English books, reference books, large-print books, foreign-language books, language courses with CD, comics and Mangas, magazines and newspapers, DVDs and BLU-RAYs, audiobooks, digital books and magazines, music and movie streaming and video games are available.

A return chute is accessible when the library is closed.

Online ressources

A variety of online resources is offered to library members, such as language courses, e-books, digital magazines, genealogy, music, etc.

Research Support and Reading Suggestions

Our attentive reference staff offer assistance to ensure members find what they are larger to the staff of th members find what they are looking for. Thematic suggestions are presented in several places in the library in order to make your selection easier. Don't miss Mathieu's suggestions for children and teens on Facebook and the library's website!



Computer Lab

The library has new computers that provide access to the Internet, databases and various software programs, including photo processing and video editing. They can be found in the children's, teen and adult sections.



Printing, Photocopying and Scanning

It is possible to print from a laptop, tablet or cellphone anywhere in the library. These services are offered at a cost of \$0.25/page for black and white and \$0.50/page for colour.

Study Room

Four study rooms are available for members. The rooms are equipped with dry-erase boards to facilitate teamwork.

Cultural Activities

The library offers a variety of cultural activities for the entire family: chess night, board game night, movie night, etc. Various activities are offered for children: Story Time, Homework Helpers, my Reading Buddy, workshop on different subjects, Coding Club, shows, etc. Certain activities are reserved for teens. Adult activities include among others, Reading Clubs, Writing Workshops, NBF Film Club, conferences on different topics and Cultural Fridays.

The library's Cultural Activities Calendar is published in January, June and September. It is available online and at the library.
