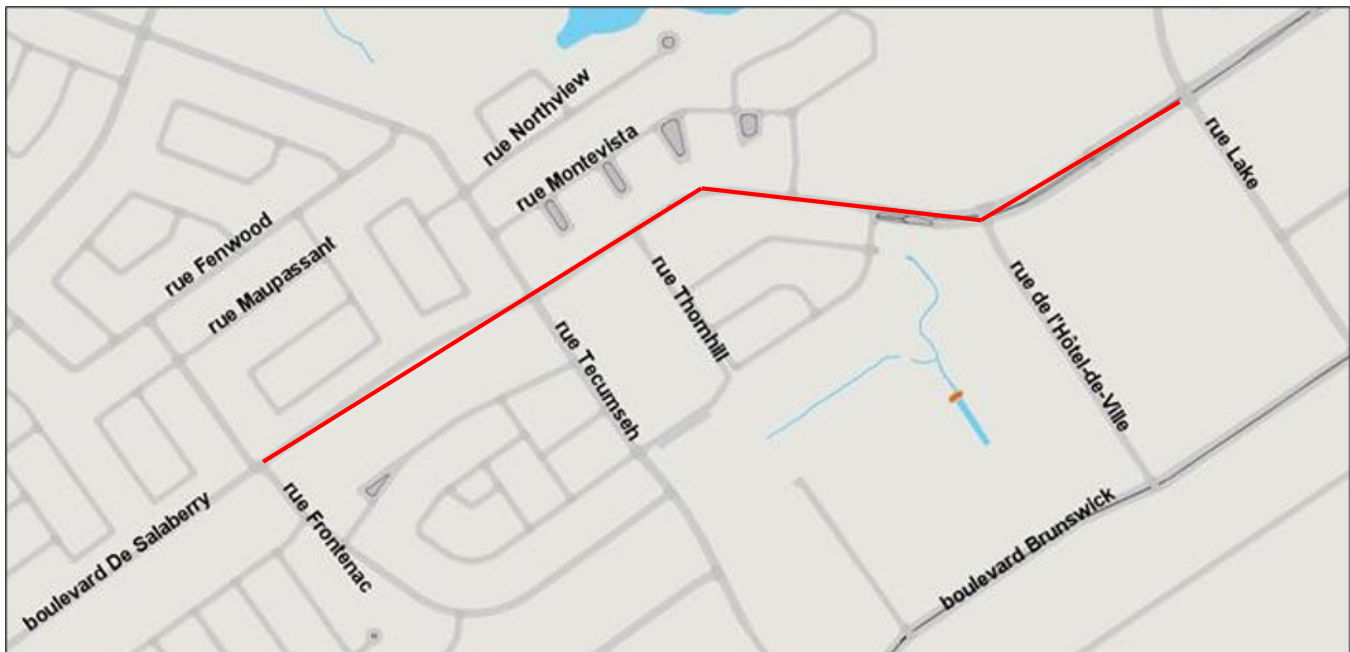


Scheduled start date: Week of June 9

Road system maintenance

Bike path on Salaberry Boulevard, between Lake street and Frontenac Street



Traffic and parking



- Obstructions and closures are planned.
- Flaggers will provide timely access to vehicles during certain activities.
- Pedestrian and bike traffic is maintained at all times.
- Please obey all signage (detours, local traffic, etc.) to ensure safety and optimize fluid travel during construction.
- The contractor is required to provide a safe perimeter around the construction site and may use parking spaces for materials or equipment.

Information about the project



- Schedule: Monday to Friday, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.; Saturday, 8 a.m. to 7 p.m.; Sunday, 9 a.m. to 7 p.m.;
- Project duration may vary depending on weather and site conditions.

Construction sequence

- Removal of part of the damaged asphalt
- Adjustment of sumps and manholes
- Installation of new asphalt
- Marking (symbols painted on the ground)

Access



- Pedestrian and bike access will be maintained at all times.
- Partial or complete street closures should be expected.
- Access to vehicles will be possible during certain activities after checking with site flaggers.
- It is important to obey all signage in effect. It will be removed after each working day, except in exceptional cases.

Road system maintenance

With freeze-thaw cycles, dense traffic and heavy vehicles making roads more fragile, we pay particular attention to the maintenance of our road network to ensure that it remains comfortable and safe for everyone.

Where is the site crew?



Managing site crew is an integral part of project planning. During stages that require a break (paint drying, concrete curing, asphalt cooling, etc.), or that are not carried out in the field (repairing a part, testing drinking water, etc.), workers are temporarily assigned to another project.
