


Emili.pet registration guide

The City of Dollard-des-Ormeaux has created an account for all animals that already have a licence. To access your account for the first time, follow these steps:

- · Click on "Log in"
- Click on "Forgot your password"
- · Enter your email address to receive a recovery link
- · Follow the instructions to access your account









1. Getting started on Emili.pet


- Visit https://emili.pet
- Click on "Registration"




• Click on "Sign up here to get a PET LICENSE" and type Dollard-des-Ormeaux



• • Select the city from the list




• Enter the number of animals to be registered, then click "Continue"



2. Creating an animal profile


- · Enter name, breed, colour, date of birth, weight, etc
- Click on "Next"




3. Creating a citizen profile

- · Enter your name, phone number, address
- The address is validated via Google Maps*
 - → If the address does not appear, click on "Address not found"
 - → If the address is not in Dollard-des-Ormeaux, an orange warning will appear, but you can continue

*Do not enter your address manually or with the auto-fill feature



· After filling in your personal details, click on "Create account"



4. Consents


- · Consent to receive notification of lost pets: optional
- · Acceptance of terms of use: mandatory

5. Uploading documents (optional)

- · If available, add proof of:
 - → Microchip
 - → Sterilization
 - → Vaccines

6. Payement

- Once you have completed all the fields, you will be redirected to the Stripe payement screen
- · Several payment options are available



7. Account access

- Once payment is complete, you can access your citizen account to:
 - → Add more pets
 - → Add licences for other towns
 - → Modify your profile
 - → View billing history
 - → Report your pet as lost
 - → Order a new medallion in the event of loss
