#### FRIENDLY REMINDERS



### Trapping wildlife is prohibited

In accordance with Article 31 of the Act respecting t

The conservation and development of wildlife (C-61.1): "No person may use a trap to capture an animal unless authorized under this Act and its regulations. Only licensed trappers or pest management professionals may legally trap groundhogs. Trapping without a

permit is punishable by fines and legal action.."

Violating this rule is **subject to fines**. More info legisquebec.gouv.qc.ca

### Remove food sources

Groundhogs are herbivores and are attracted to vegetable gardens, fruit trees, and clover.

# Consistency is key

Most repellents must be reapplied every few days or after rain. Use a combination of methods for best results.

#### REPELLENT METHODS



### Apple cider vinegar spray

Spray a 50/50 mix of apple cider vinegar and water near burrow entrances or garden edges. The strong smell deters digging.

#### **Epsom** salt sprinkle

Spread around garden beds and burrow entrances. The smell repels groundhogs, and it also benefits soil in moderation.

# Irish Spring soap

Shave bars and scatter around areas of activity—strong scent discourages burrowing.

#### **W**Used cat litter

Place a small bag of used (non-clumping) cat litter near burrow entrances. The scent suggests predators nearby and may encourage relocation.

#### Dog or human hair

Sprinkle in garden beds and around burrows to signal predator presence—chemical-free deterrent.

#### PHYSICAL BARRIERS & NON-REPELLENT METHODS

# Burrow blocking (Safe for pets and kids)

Wait until the groundhog leaves, then fill the hole with gravel, followed by soil, and secure with mesh or a rock slab. Avoid blocking active burrows with babies (typically May–July).

### Garden fencing (Safe for pets and kids)

Use L-shaped mesh fencing (at least 3 feet tall and 1 foot underground, bent outward). Groundhogs are strong diggers—this discourages tunneling.

### Trim plants near structures

Keep vegetation low around sheds, decks, and foundations to reduce shelter opportunities.

### Motion-activated sprinklers

Startles without harm and discourages return visits.

#### UNSAFE FOR PETS AND KIDS SECTION

# Multrasonic repellents (Not safe for pets and kids)

Devices emit high-pitched sounds to deter rodents. May affect pet behavior or hearing—not recommended in homes with cats or dogs.

# Capsaicin-based sprays (Not safe for pets and kids)

These sprays contain hot pepper extract and can irritate pets or children if touched or ingested. **Use** with gloves and keep out of reach.

# Garlic and cayenne mix (Not safe for pets)

Homemade repellent using crushed garlic, cayenne pepper, and water. Can irritate pets' paws, eyes, and digestive systems.
